In the interests of fairness and natural justice, we believe members who are complained about have a right to know who has made the complaint and the substance of the

allegations made against them. We are unlikely to withhold your identity or the details of your complaint unless you have good reason to believe that:

- You believe you may be victimised or harassed by the Member(s) against whom you are making a complaint (or by a person(s) associated with them).
- May receive less favourable treatment from the Council because of the position of the Member(s) you are complaining about, in terms of any existing Council service provision or any tender / contract that you may have or are about to submit to the Council.

Please note that requests for confidentiality or requests for suppression of complaint details will not automatically be granted. The Standards Sub-Committee will consider the request alongside the substance of your complaint. The Monitoring Officer will then contact you with the decision. If your request for confidentiality is not granted, you will be able to withdraw your complaint.

However, it is important to understand that in certain exceptional circumstances where the matter complained about is very serious, we can proceed with an investigation or other action and disclose your name even if you have expressly asked us not to.

Once a valid complaint relating to an alleged breach of the Code of Conduct for Members has been received by the Monitoring Officer, it will be presented to a meeting of the Standards Sub-Committee for consideration / determination. The Standards Sub-Committee will ordinarily meet in public unless the information is exempt information as defined by the Local Government Act 1972 Schedule 12 A as amended.

The Sub-Committee may resolve to:

- (a) dismiss your complaint, with reasons. The decision of the Standards Sub-Committee is final, you do not have a right of appeal
- (b) ask you for additional information, with reasons;
- (c) refer your complaint to the Monitoring Officer for investigation (or other action); or
