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An analysis of the English Indices of Deprivation for South Gloucestershire 2010

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1. Introduction and Background

1.1 Introduction

This report presents the findings of the English Indices of Deprivation 2010 (ID 2010) for South Gloucestershire.

The ID 2010 is the Government's official measure of multiple deprivation at small area level.

The mapping of deprivation serves to emphasise the contrasting socio-economic conditions that are found within the district and throughout England. The indices will be used by Government to inform the targeting of regeneration resources and will provide evidence for identifying and monitoring areas of deprivation within the district.

The report firstly provides an overview of how the indices are constructed, then looks at how the results should be interpreted before commenting on and mapping the results of each of the indices for South Gloucestershire at Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) level. Further commentary is provided on the district level results.

1.2. Background

The Indices of Deprivation 2010 (ID 2010) was commissioned by the Department of Communities and Local Government (DCLG) and produced by the Social Disadvantage Research Centre (SDRC) at the Department of Social Policy and Social Research at the University of Oxford. It updates the Indices of Deprivation 2007 (ID07) and the Indices of Deprivation 2004 (ID 2004).

The new ID 2010 is based on the approach structure and methodology used previously to create the ID 2007 and ID 2004.

The ID 2010 identifies concentrations of deprivation, however it is important to remember that deprivation is experienced by individuals living in an area. Not all people living in a deprived area will be deprived and, similarly, not all deprived people live in deprived areas. People may be counted as deprived in one or more of the domains depending on the number of types of deprivation that they experience.

2. Methodology

2.1. The domains

The ID 2010 comprises 7 domains at Lower Super Output Area (LSOA). These domains are then combined to create an overall LSOA level Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD).

The seven domains are:

- 1. Income deprivation
- 2. Employment deprivation
- 3. Health and disability deprivation
- 4. Education, skills and training deprivation
- 5. Barriers to housing and services deprivation
- 6. Living environment deprivation
- 7. Crime deprivation

There are also two supplementary indices within the income domain; income deprivation affecting children and income deprivation affecting older people.

2.2 The indicators

The domains are created from a total of 38 indicators. The criteria for inclusion of these indicators were that they should be:-

- domain specific and appropriate for the purpose (as direct as possible measures of that form of deprivation);
- measuring major features of that deprivation (not conditions just experienced by a very small number of people or areas);
- up-to-date;
- capable of being updated on a regular basis;
- statistically robust and;
- available for the whole of England at a small area level in a consistent form.

For the majority of the datasets underpinning the ID 2010, the data time point is mid 2008 or as close as possible to this date.

A list of the indicators is provided against each domain in section 4.

2.3 The geography (Super Output Areas)

The ID 2010, like the ID07 and ID04 is based on small geographical areas called Lower Level Super Output Areas (LSOAs). LSOAs were created by the Office of National Statistics (ONS) in 2004 to provide a consistent small area statistical geography throughout England.


There are 32,482 LSOAs in England. They have an average population of 1,500. In South Gloucestershire there are 162 LSOAs.

For the IMD and each of the separate domains a score has been calculated for every LSOA in the country. The scores have then been ranked from 1 (most deprived) to 32,482 (least deprived).

2.4 Implications of the 2007 Ward Boundary Changes

Ward boundary changes introduced in May 2007 affect the way in which data from the ID 2010 (and ID07) is presented.

Prior to May 2007 ward and LSOA boundaries were aligned and whole LSOAs were 'nested' within wards. This is no longer the case. In many instances new ward boundaries intersect LSOAs, resulting in an LSOA being split between two (or more) wards as illustrated below:

Appendix A-AJ show the location of LSOAs within each of South Gloucestershire's 35 wards.

Most tables in this report include a 'ward reference column'. Where the LSOA is split between wards the proportion of the households in each of the constituent wards is listed. For example LSOA E01014925 (as illustrated above) is split between three wards:

- Kings Chase ward 74% of households
- Siston Ward 19% of households
- Rodway Ward 7% of households

3. Interpreting the results

3.1 Published data for Lower Super Output Areas

As outlined above, each LSOA in England (32,482) has been assigned a score and a rank for each of the following domains:

- Index of multiple deprivation
- Income deprivation
- Employment deprivation
- Health deprivation and disability deprivation
- Education, skills and training deprivation
- Barriers to housing and services deprivation
- Crime deprivation
- Living environment deprivation

All domains have been assigned a rank out of the 32,482 LSOAs in England. The most deprived LSOA is given a rank of 1, and the least deprived a rank of 32,482. The ranks show how an LSOA compares to all other LSOAs in the country and are easily interpretable. However the scores indicate the distances between each rank, as these will vary.

The scores for the income and employment domains are rates. So, for example, if an LSOA scores 38.6 in the income domain, this means that 38.6% of the LSOAs population are income deprived. The same applies to the employment domain, the income deprivation affecting children and income deprivation affecting older people sub-domains. The scores for the remaining domains are not rates. Within a domain the higher the score, the more deprived an LSOA is. However, the scores should not be compared between domains as they have different minimum and maximum values, and ranges. To compare between domains the ranks should be used.

Data time point

In most cases, the indicators in the IMD 2010 relate to 2008, which was the generally the most upto date time period when the index was constructed. For indicators where it was not possible to obtain 2008 data – for example, those based on Census data – this is indicated in the text. As with previous Indices, the IMD 2010 only used Census data when alternative data from administrative sources were not available. Three indicators were derived from the 2001 Census – adult skill levels in the Education, Skills and Training Deprivation Domain, household overcrowding in the Barriers to Housing and Services Domain and houses without central heating in the Living Environment Deprivation Domain.

3.2 Comparison with previous Indices of Deprivation (ID04 and ID07)

When making comparisons between the ID 2010 and previous iterations of the Indices of Deprivation (ID 2004 and ID 2007), it is important to note that the ID measures the relative positions of small areas in terms of deprivation. It says nothing about absolute levels of deprivation. Therefore it is impossible to tell whether a change is a real change in the deprivation of an area or whether it is due to the scores of other areas going up or down. If all areas improved at relatively the same rate, then the indices of deprivation rankings would remain the same. Therefore if an LSOA is now ranked 125th nationally compared to 200th in 2007, we can say that that LSOA has become **RELATIVELY** more deprived in comparison to other areas, although actual levels of deprivation may have improved, worsened or stayed the same.

<u>Comparison between ID2010 and ID2007</u> <u>should therefore be carried out with caution.</u>

3.3 About Deprivation Quintiles

Tables, graphs and maps in this report refer to 'deprivation quintiles'. Quintiles are fifths, the 1st quintile being the most deprived fifth (or 20%) and the 5th quintile being the least deprived fifth (or 20%).

In this report deprivation quintiles are used to show how LSOAs relate to others within a defined area. Maps and tables in this report use the following colour code:

Colour	Quintile	Meaning
	1 st	Most deprived 20% in England
	2 nd	Most deprived 20-40% in England
	3 rd	Most deprived 40-60% in England
	4 th	Least deprived 20-40% in England
	5 th	Least deprived 20% in England

4 Super Output level Analysis for South Gloucestershire

4.1 Summary Analysis

Table 1 (pages 5-14) illustrates the relative position of LSOAs in South Gloucestershire for each domain of the ID 2010 and their corresponding rank for the ID 2007 and ID2004.

How the information is presented

The data has been sorted alphabetically by ward (so all LSOAs within that ward are grouped together). As outlined in section 2.4, the ward boundary changes of May 2007 mean that some LSOAs are split between two or more wards (for more detail on LSOA boundaries refer to Appendix A-AJ)

For each of the domains, data for South Gloucestershire has been ranked 1 to 162. A rank of 1 has been given to the most deprived LSOA and a rank of 162 given to the least deprived LSOA.

The cells have then been colour coded to represent the position of the LSOA in a national (England) context as outlined in section 3.3.

In simple terms rows of red / orange indicate areas which are deprived across a range of indicators whilst green rows indicate less deprived areas.

Key facts about South Gloucestershire

- The results reinforce previously identified patterns of deprivation across the district. South Gloucestershire's most deprived areas are generally areas with high concentrations of social housing (particularly former local authority housing estates).
- E01014977 the Pendennis Road area of Staple Hill is South Gloucestershire's most deprived LSOA in five of the eight domains (including the IMD) - (the same number as in 2007). This LSOA features in the most deprived national quintile (most deprived 20% of LSOAs in England) in six of the eight domains (7 in 2004). It is South Gloucestershire's most deprived LSOA in terms of the IMD, Income, employment, Health and disability, and the living environment domain.

- E01014926 the New Cheltenham Road area of Kings Chase ward features in the most deprived national deprivation quintile in four domains; Income deprivation, employment deprivation, Education skills and training, and Crime. In 2007 this area only featured in 3 domains (Employment was excluded).
- There are 40 LSOA's that feature within the 20% most deprived areas nationally in at least one domain. This is significantly higher than in both 2007 (26) and 2004 (21).
- With the exception of the 'Barriers to housing and services domain', South Gloucestershire's most deprived LSOAs tend to be located within the urban wards of Staple Hill, Patchway, and Kings Chase. Additionally, LSOA's within:
 - Woodstock, Hanham, Filton, Oldland Common and Rodway - feature in the Crime domain;
 - Parkwall, Dodington, Emersons Green and Yate North - feature in the Education Skills and Training domain
- Three LSOA's feature in the least deprived national quintile in every domain:
 - E01014988 the Thornbury Hospital / Knapp Road area of Thornbury
 - E01014877 the Wheatfield Primary School area of Bradley Stoke, and;
 - E01014879 the Ash Ridge Road area of Bradley Stoke

Chart 1 shows the minimum, maximum and mean national ranking for LSOAs in South Gloucestershire for each of the eight domains. The chart enables comparison between the domains and shows where Gloucestershire's most and least deprived LSOAs are on a national scale. It also shows which domains have the widest and narrowest range of results. A long line indicates more variation in levels of deprivation than a short line. The mean value indicates the average rank of LSOAs for the domain. A lower mean rank indicates more deprivation than a higher mean rank.

- 'Crime' is the domain with the lowest mean rank (17,247) – indicating higher levels of deprivation across the district, whilst the 'the Health deprivation and disability domain has the highest mean rank (26,028) indicating the lowest levels of deprivation across the district.
- 'Crime' is also the domain with the lowest ranking LSOA (374), whilst the districts highest ranking LSOA is within the composite IMD (ranked 32,428 nationally).

• The widest range of LSOA rankings is illustrated in the Crime Domain; a difference of 31,639 rank places between the most and least deprived LSOAs.

Table 2 overleaf shows the most and least deprived LSOAs in South Gloucestershire for each of the eight Domains and the Income sub-domains.

Charts 2 to 9 on page 17 show the distribution of LSOAs in South Gloucestershire in terms of national deprivation quintiles for each of the eight domains. In most domains the majority of LSOA's fall within the least deprived quintiles (Q4 and Q5), with the notable exception of the Crime domain – where 21 LSOA's are within the 20% most deprived LSOA's nationally, and the Education, skills and training domain where 56 LSOA's fall within the 40% most deprived areas nationally. These results are described and explained further in section 4.



Charts 2-9 - Distribution of LSOAs in South Gloucestershire in terms of national deprivation quintiles, 2010




Chart 2. Index of Multiple Deprivation




Chart 3. Income deprivation




Chart 4. Employment deprivation





Chart 5. Health and disability deprivation






Chart 7. Barriers to housing and services




Chart 8. Crime deprivation




Chart 9. Living environment deprivation

4. Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) level analysis for South Gloucestershire:

4.2 Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD)

The overall Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) describes the Super Output Area by combining information from all seven domains. The domains were combined in two stages; first the domain scores were ranked then transformed into an exponential distribution then the domains were combined using the following weights:

Because of the exponential distribution it is not possible to say, for example, that an LSOA with a score of 40 is twice as deprived as an LSOA with a score of 20. To make comparisons between the LSOAs the ranks should be used. The IMD 2007 is ranked in the same way as the domain indices, that is, a rank of 1 is assigned to the most deprived LSOA and a rank of 32,482 is assigned to the least deprived LSOA nationally.

Some facts about South Gloucestershire in this domain

- South Gloucestershire's most deprived LSOA remains E01014977, the Pendennis Road area of Staple Hill ward (ranked 4,840th nationally) (Map 2). This is the only local area which features in the most deprived 20% of LSOAs nationally. The area has become relatively more deprived since 2007 (when it was ranked 5,492).
- Sixteen LSOAs fall within the most deprived 20-40% of areas in England, twice as many as in both 2007 and 2004 (8) (Chart 10).
- In terms of the composite IMD South Gloucestershire has become more deprived since 2007. Chart 10 illustrates how the proportion of LSOA's has shifted, from the less deprived to more deprived national quintiles.
- The range between the most and least deprived LSOA's has increased illustrating a wider gap between South Gloucestershire's

most and least deprived areas (Chart 11). The average rank position has also fallen. However, almost half of South Gloucestershire's LSOAs (78) are within the 20% least deprived areas in England - the same number as in 2007.


• South Gloucestershire's least deprived LSOA is E01014877, the area between Wheatfield Primary School and Bristol Distribution Park, in Bradley Stoke The area is ranked 32,428th nationally which means it is the 54th least deprived area in England.

LSOA level changes between ID2010 and ID07

Comparing LSOA ranks between the ID2010 and previous ID's, should be carried out with caution because the rankings are relative – i.e. the score / rank of an LSOA is affected by the scores of every other LSOA nationally, therefore it is impossible to tell whether a change in score is a 'real' change in the deprivation level of an area, or whether it is due to other areas going up or down. For interest however the LSOA's which have undergone the greatest change since ID 2007 are set out in tables 4 and 5. The data shows that the LSOA's with the greatest relative increases in deprivation are:

- E01014983, the area around Little Stoke Primary School in Stoke Gifford, which has fallen 5,617 rank places (ψ 17%). Since 2007 this LSOA has undergone relative increases in deprivation across every domain. The reasons for these changes are unclear but the LSOA contains a number of properties managed by registered social landlords. in Little Stoke Way / Hawkesley Drive.
- E01014971, the 'Siston / Siston Common Area' which has fallen 5,617 (Ψ 16%) rank places since 2007. This LSOA contains the major 'Siston Hill' residential development which saw it's first housing completions between 2006 and 2007. The affordable housing element was delivered in this first phase of the development, so may be reflected in the data (which generally have a 2008 base date). This LSOA has seen particularly large increases in relative deprivation in the income and employment domains since 2007.
- Three LSOA's within the Filton ward have also seen particularly large decreases in rank position since 2007.

Further analysis of the underlying data and / or local proxy measures would be necessary to ascertain whether these changes are 'real'.







Chart 10 - Distribution of LSOAs by national quintiles

4.2 Income Deprivation Domain

This domain measures the proportion of the population in an area that live in income deprived families. The definition of income deprivation adopted here includes both families that are out-of-work and families that are in work but who have low earnings (and who satisfy the respective means tests).

The indicators

A combined count of income deprived individuals per Lower layer Super Output Area (LSOA) is calculated by summing the following five indicators:

- Adults and children in Income Support families (August 2008)
- Adults and children in income-based Jobseeker's Allowance families (August 2008)
- Adults and children in Pension Credit (Guarantee) families
- Adults and children in Child Tax Credit families (who are not claiming Income Support, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- or Pension Credit) whose equivalised income (excluding housing benefits) is below 60% of the median before housing costs • Asylum seekers in England in receipt of subsistence support, accommodation support, or both (September 2008).

The combined count of income deprived individuals per LSOA forms the numerator of an income deprivation rate which is expressed as a proportion of the total LSOA population.

Changes since the ID2007

There have not been any changes since the ID2007.

Some facts about South Gloucestershire in this domain...

- E01014977, the Pendennis Road area of Staple Hill is South Gloucestershire's most deprived area (Map 4); 27.1% of the population of this LSOA are income deprived. This area has become relatively less deprived since 2007 (rising from a national rank position of 4,599th in 2007 to 4,870th in 2010). However, the LSOA remains relatively more deprived than it was in 2004 (when it was ranked 5,226th).
- Table 6 shows that two LSOAs in South Gloucestershire feature in the 20% most deprived LSOAs in England. These are E01014977 (as discussed above) and E01014926 - the New Cheltenham Road area of Kings Chase ward (ranked 5,108th nationally). This is consistent with the findings of the ID2007.
- Chart 12 shows that the results of this domain are broadly consistent with those reported in 2007 and 2004. However, 24 LSOAs now fall within the second national deprivation quintile (the 20-40% most deprived areas in England), four more than in 2007. Additionally, sixty three (39%) of South Gloucestershire's LSOAs fall within the 20% least deprived areas in England, five fewer than in 2007 (68).
- There are 5 LSOAs where more than 1 in 5 residents (20%) are 'income deprived' and across South Gloucestershire as a whole


there are 20,855 residents who are 'income deprived' (See section 5.6 for details).

• E01014901, the area surrounding Bromley Heath Infants & Junior School in Downend ward is the least deprived LSOA in the district in terms of this domain (ranked 32,014th nationally).

LSOA level changes between ID2010 and ID07

Comparing LSOA ranks between the ID2010 and previous ID's, should be carried out with caution because the rankings are relative – i.e. the score / rank of an LSOA is affected by the scores of every other LSOA nationally, therefore it is impossible to tell whether a change in score is a 'real' change in the deprivation level of an area, or whether it is due to other areas going up or down. However, for interest the LSOA's which have undergone the greatest change since ID 2007 are set out in tables 7 and 8.

It is worth noting that LSOA- E01014971 – which covers the 'Siston / Siston Common Area' is the LSOA which has become relatively more deprived to the greatest extent – falling 6,925 (21%) rank places between 2007 and 2010. Further analysis of the underlying data and / or local proxy measures would be necessary to ascertain whether these changes are 'real'. However, it is worth noting that this LSOA contains the major Siston Hill residential development which saw it's first housing completions between 2006 and 2007 and the affordable housing element was delivered in this first phase.




Chart 12 – Distribution of LSOAs by national quintiles





Chart 13 - Range of national rank positions

4.3 Employment Deprivation Domain

This domain measures employment deprivation conceptualised as involuntary exclusion of the working age population from the world of work. The employment deprived are defined as those who would like to work but are unable to do so through unemployment, sickness or disability.

The indicators

- A combined count of employment deprived individuals per LSOA is calculated by summing the following seven indicators:
- Claimants of Jobseeker's Allowance (both contribution-based and income based), women aged 18-59 and men aged 18-64
 Claimants of Incapacity Benefit aged 18-59/64
- Claimants of Neupacity bench aged 10 37/04
 Claimants of Severe Disablement Allowance aged 18-59/64
- Claimants of Employment and Support Allowance aged 18-59/64 (those with a contribution-based element)
- Participants in New Deal for 18-24s who are not claiming Jobseeker's Allowance
- Participants in New Deal for 25+ who are not claiming Jobseeker's Allowance
- Participants in New Deal for Lone Parents aged 18 and over (after initial interview).

The combined count of employment deprived individuals per LSOA forms the numerator of an employment deprivation rate which is expressed as a proportion of of the working age population (women aged 18-59 and men aged 18-64) in the LSOA.

Changes since the ID2007

The introduction of Employment and Support Allowance in October 2008 required this indicator to be added to the domain in order to retain consistency with the definition adopted for the ID2007..

Some facts about South Gloucestershire in this domain...

- LSOA E01014977, the Pendennis Road area of Staple Hill is South Gloucestershire's most deprived area in terms of this domain (Map 6). 18.3% of the population of this LSOA are considered to be 'employment deprived'. The area has become relatively more deprived since 2007 falling in national rank position from 4,358th to 3,798th.
- Table 5 shows that three LSOA's appear within the 20% most deprived areas in England, two more than in 2007. The LSOA's are E01014977 (as discussed above), E01014948 – the Coniston North area of Patchway and E01014926 – the New Cheltenham Road area of Kingschase.
- Chart 14 shows that since 2007 there has been an increase in the number of LSOA's within the most deprived and second most deprived quintiles (+6) at the expense of a reduction in the number of LSOA's within the least deprived quintile (-7). The range between the most and least deprived LSOA's has also increased (Chart 15).
- There are 20 LSOAs where more than one in ten residents (10%) are 'employment deprived' and across South Gloucestershire as a whole there are 8,865 residents who are 'employment deprived'.

- 42% of LSOAs in South Gloucestershire (68) are within the 20% least deprived areas in England.
- In terms of employment deprivation, South Gloucestershire's least deprived LSOA is E01014997 – Hambrook / Stoke Park Area of Frenchay & Stoke Park Ward (ranked 32,275th nationally)

LSOA level changes between ID2010 and ID07

Comparing LSOA ranks between the ID2010 and previous ID's, should be carried out with caution because the rankings are relative – i.e. the score / rank of an LSOA is affected by the scores of every other LSOA nationally, therefore it is impossible to tell whether a change in score is a 'real' change in the deprivation level of an area, or whether it is due to other areas going up or down. The LSOA's which have undergone the greatest change since ID 2007 are set out in tables 10 and 11.

It is worth noting that LSOA-E01014974 – the Page Park Area of Staple Hill is the LSOA which has become relatively more deprived to the greatest extent – falling 5,851 (18%) rank places between 2007 and 2010. Further analysis of the underlying data and / or local proxy measures would be necessary to ascertain whether these changes are 'real'. But, it is worth noting that this LSOA contains 14 new Housing Association units which became occupied in 2008 (the base date for data used to construct the index).






Chart 14 – Distribution of LSOAs by national quintiles





Chart 15 - Range of national rank positions

4.4 Health Deprivation and Disability Domain

This domain measures premature death and the impairment of quality of life by poor health. It considers both physical and mental health. The domain measures morbidity, disability and premature mortality but not aspects of behaviour or environment that may be predictive of future health deprivation.

The indicators

- Years of Potential Life Lost: An age and sex standardised measure of premature death.
- Comparative Illness and Disability Ratio: An age and sex standardised morbidity/disability ratio.
- Acute morbidity: An age and sex standardised rate of emergency admission to hospital.
- Mood and anxiety disorders: The rate of adults suffering from mood and anxiety disorders.

Changes since the ID2007

No changes have been made to the indicators or methodology. The only difference with the domain concerns the mood and anxiety disorders indicator, for which it was not possible to obtain updated prescribing data. The prescribing data therefore relate to a time point of 2005. Updated data were obtained for the other three components of this indicator.


- This is the domain in which South Gloucestershire is least deprived.
- LSOA E01014977 the Pendennis Road Pleasant Road area of Staple Hill is, by some margin, South Gloucestershire's most deprived LSOA in terms of this domain (ranked 4,064th nationally). This is the only local area which features in the 20% most deprived areas nationally and has become more deprived since 2007.
- Only one LSOA (E01014948 the Coniston North area of Patchway) features in the second national quintile (the 20-40% most deprived areas nationally). In comparison, there were 4 LSOA's in this quintile in 2007.
- 63% (102) of South Gloucestershire's LSOA's are within the 20% least deprived LSOA's in England, significantly fewer than in 2007 (22).
- LSOA E01014966 the Emerald Park / Howsmoor Lane area of Emersons Green is South Gloucestershire's least deprived LSOA in terms of this domain. The area is ranked 32,362nd nationally.

LSOA level changes between ID2010 and ID07

Comparing LSOA ranks between the ID2010 and previous ID's, should be carried out with caution because the rankings are relative – i.e. the score / rank of an LSOA is affected by the scores of every other LSOA nationally, therefore it is impossible to tell whether a change in score is a 'real' change in the deprivation level of an area, or whether it is due to other areas going up or down. The LSOA's which have undergone the greatest change since ID 2007 are set out in tables 13 and 14.

It is worth noting that LSOA- E01014989 – the Falfield area of Thornbury North / Charfield Ward is the LSOA which has become relatively more deprived to the greatest extent – falling 10,426 (32%) rank places between 2007 and 2010. Further analysis of the underlying data and / or local proxy measures would be necessary to ascertain whether these changes are 'real'.







Chart 16 – Distribution of LSOAs by national quintiles

4.5 Education, Skills and Training Deprivation Domain

This domain captures the extent of deprivation in education, skills and training in an area. The indicators fall into two sub-domains: one relating to children and young people and one relating to adult skills. These two sub-domains are designed to reflect the 'flow' and 'stock' of educational disadvantage within an area respectively. That is, the 'children and young people' sub-domain measures the attainment of qualifications and associated measures ('flow'), while the 'skills' sub-domain measures the lack of qualifications in the resident working age adult population ('stock').

The indicators

Sub-domain: Children and Young People

• Key Stage 2 attainment: The average points score of pupils taking English, maths and science Key Stage 2 exams.

- Key Stage 3 attainment: The average points score of pupils taking English, maths and science Key Stage 3 exams.
- Key Stage 4 attainment: The average capped points score of pupils taking Key Stage 4 (GCSE or equivalent) exams.
- Secondary school absence: The proportion of authorised and unauthorised absences from secondary school.
- Staying on in education post 16: The proportion of young people not staying on in school or non-advanced education above age 16.

• Entry to higher education: The proportion of young people aged under 21 not entering higher education.

Sub-domain: Skills

• Adult skills: The proportion of working age adults aged 25-54 with no or low qualifications.

Changes since the ID2007

In the ID2007 the average points score at Key Stage 2 and 3 indicators made use of the actual test scores rather than the level achieved (as in the ID2004). For the ID2010 the methodology reverted back to the use of levels. This change is to make the indicator consistent with average score data published by the Department for Education.

In the ID2007 the secondary school absence rate indicator was derived from school level data and each pupil assigned their school's two year average absence rate, which was then averaged across an LSOA. A measure of secondary school absence at LSOA level based on individual pupil absences has become available since the ID2007 and data are published by the Department for Education as National Statistics. This is a more accurate measure of absence rates at LSOA level and therefore has been used in the ID2010.





4.6 Barriers to Housing and Services Domain

This domain measures the physical and financial accessibility of housing and key local services. The indicators fall into two sub-domains: 'geographical barriers', which relate to the physical proximity of local services, and 'wider barriers' which includes issues relating to access to housing such as affordability.

The indicators

Sub-domain: Wider Barriers

• Household overcrowding: The proportion of all households in an LSOA which are judged to have insufficient space to meet the household's needs.

- Homelessness: The rate of acceptances for housing assistance under the homelessness provisions of housing legislation.
- Housing affordability: The difficulty of access to owner-occupation, expressed as a proportion of households aged under 35 whose income means that they are unable to afford to enter owner occupation.

Sub-domain: Geographical Barriers

- Road distance to a GP surgery: A measure of the mean distance to the closest GP surgery for people living in the LSOA.
- Road distance to a food shop: A measure of the mean distance to the closest supermarket or general store for people living in the LSOA.

Road distance to a primary school: A measure of the mean distance to the closest primary school for people living in the LSOA.
Road distance to a Post Office: A measure of the mean distance to the closest post office or sub post office for people living in the LSOA.


- LSOA E01014962, the Rural Area surrounding Oldbury on Severn in Severn Ward is South Gloucestershire's most deprived LSOA in terms of this domain. The area is ranked 619th nationally and has become relatively more deprived since 2007.



4.7 Crime Domain

Crime is an important feature of deprivation that has major effects on individuals and communities. The purpose of this domain is to measure the rate of recorded crime for four major crime types – violence, burglary, theft and criminal damage – representing the risk of personal and material victimisation at a small area level.

The indicators

- Violence: The rate of violence (19 recorded crime types) per 1000 at-risk population.
- Burglary: The rate of burglary (4 recorded crime types) per 1000 at-risk properties.
- The fit: The rate of theft (5 recorded crime types) per 1000 at-risk population.

The amendments to Home Office counting rules in April 2008 resulted in a slight reconfiguration of some of the notifiable offence categories but no substantive changes to the composite indicator definitions.

Some facts about South Gloucestershire in this domain...

- This is the domain in which South Gloucestershire is most deprived. Twenty one (21) of LSOA's fall within the 20% most deprived areas in England (10 in 2007); 4 of which fall within the 5% most deprived LSOA's nationally (there were none in 2007).
- LSOA E01015007, which covers the Holy Trinity Church / Orchard Road / Cecil Road area of Woodstock Ward (Map 13) remains South Gloucestershire's most deprived area in terms of this domain. The LSOA is ranked 374th nationally which means it is within the most deprived 2% of areas in England and has become relatively more deprived since 2007 (where it was ranked 1,644th nationally.
- South Gloucestershire's most deprived area in terms of this domain tend to be focussed in the urban wards around the East and north Fringes of Bristol (Map 14).
- Twenty one (21) of South Gloucestershire's LSOA's are within the 20% least deprived areas nationally, significantly fewer than in 2007 (51 LSOA's).
- South Gloucestershire's least deprived LSOA in terms of this domain is E01014987 – the Alexandra Way area of Thornbury North ward ranked 32,013th nationally.





4.8 Living Environment Deprivation Domain

This domain measures the quality of individuals' immediate surroundings both within and outside the home. The indicators fall into two sub-domains: the 'indoors' living environment, which measures the quality of housing, and the 'outdoors' living environment which contains two measures relating to air quality and road traffic accidents.

The indicators

Sub-domain: The 'indoors' living environment

- Housing in poor condition: The proportion of social and private homes that fail to meet the decent homes standard.
- Houses without central heating: The proportion of houses that do not have central heating.
- Sub-domain: The 'outdoors' living environment
- Air quality: A measure of air quality based on emissions rates for four pollutants.
- Road traffic accidents: A measure of road traffic accidents involving injury

Changes since the ID2007

No changes have been made to the indicators or methodology. The only difference with the domain concerns the housing in poor condition indicator, which has not been updated from the ID2007 due to cost considerations. This indicator therefore relates to a time point of 2005 and is as used in the ID2007.

- E01014977, the Pendennis Road area of Staple Hill remains South Gloucestershire's most deprived area in terms of this domain. The LSOA is ranked 4,586th nationally and has become relatively more deprived since 2007.
- There are two LSOA's within the most deprived 20% of areas in England: E01014977 (as outlined above) and E01014950- the Rodway / Windermere area of Patchway (Table 10).
- The largest proportion of South Gloucestershire's LSOA's (64) remain in the least deprived 20% of areas nationally, however this is fewer than was recorded in 2007 (Chart 24).






Chart 24 – Distribution of LSOAs by national quintiles





Chart 25 - Range of national rank positions

4.9 SUB-DOMAINS (Supplementary indicators)

4.9.1 Income deprivation affecting children index (IDACI)

The supplementary Income Deprivation Affecting Children (IDAC) Index is a subset of the Income Deprivation Domain and shows the percentage of children (aged 0-15) living in income deprived families.

The indicators

As set out in Income Deprivation Domain. This covers only children aged 0-15 living in income deprived households, defined as either families receiving Income Support or income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Pension Credit (Guarantee) or those not in receipt of these benefits but in receipt of Child Tax Credit with an equivalised income (excluding housing benefits) below 60% of the national median before housing costs.

Changes since the ID2007

There have not been any changes since the ID2007.

- E01014941, the area South of Coronation Park, in Parkwall Ward is South Gloucestershire's most deprived area in terms of this sub-domain (ranked 5,270th nationally), 38% of children living in this area are 'income deprived'. This area has become relatively more deprived since 2007.
- Three LSOAs feature in the most deprived national quintile, the same number as in 2007:






Chart 26 – Distribution of LSOAs by national quintiles





Chart 27 - Range of national rank positions



Some facts about South Gloucestershire in this domain....

- LSOA E01014977 Pendennis Road area of Staple Hill remains South Gloucestershire's most deprived area in terms of this indicator (ranked 5,629th nationally) and is relatively less deprived than in 2007.
- E01014977 is one of two local LSOAs within the 20% most deprived areas nationally. The other is E01014927, the area North of Kingswood High Street, Kings Chase Ward.
- The results of this domain are generally consistent with those of the ID 2007,
- E010149901 The area surrounding Bromley Heath Infants & Junior School in Downend is the least deprived LSOA in South Gloucestershire (ranked 32,321 nationally).







Deprivation scores should not be directly compared between 2010 and 2007 because an area's score is affected by the scores of every other area; so it is impossible to tell whether a change in score is a real change in the deprivation level of an area, or whether it is due to the scores of other areas going up or down. Further analysis of the underlying data and / or local proxy measures would be necessary to ascertain whether these changes are 'real'. The following changes within individual LSOA between the ID 2010 and ID 2007 are however particularly large and worthy of further investigation:

5. DISTRICT LEVEL ANALYSIS

5.1 Introduction

The ID 2010 provides local authority district level results which enable direct comparison between local authorities in England.

Local Authority districts are complex to describe as a whole or to compare for several reasons. Firstly, districts can vary enormously in population size. Further more, some districts may have a more mixed population, containing more variation in deprivation and in some places deprivation may be concentrated in severe pockets rather than being more evenly spread. This makes an overall picture more difficult to establish. For a more detailed or subtle description of deprivation across a district the LSOA results should be used as the LSOA level Index of Multiple Deprivation contains the most detailed account of local deprivation. At the LSOA level much more information is retained than with the district level summaries.

At the district level, six measures have been devised which take account of these issues and which describe the district in different ways. The measures are:

Average of LSOA Ranks

Population weighted average of the combined ranks for the LSOAs in a district

Average of LSOA Scores

Population weighted average of the combined scores for the LSOAs in a district.

• Extent

The proportion of the population living in LSOAs which rank within the most deprived LSOAS in England. The measure aims to show how widespread high levels of deprivation are in a district.

Local Concentration

The population weighted average of the ranks of a district's most deprived LSOAs that contain exactly 10% of the district's

population. This measure is used to show 'hot spots' of deprivation.

Income Scale

The actual Number of people who are income deprived.

• Employment Scale

The actual number of people who are employment deprived.

There are 326 local authority districts in England. For each measure, each district is given a rank and score. For presentation, a rank of 1 indicates that the district is the most deprived according to the measure and 326 is the least deprived.

Table 33 shows the district level results for South Gloucestershire for the ID 2007 compared to those from the ID2004.

Tables 34-39 show the 20 most deprived local authorities in England for each of the 6 district measures of deprivation.

5.2. Average of LSOA Ranks

This measure summarises the district as a whole by averaging all the LSOA <u>ranks</u> in each district. LSOA ranks are population weighted within a district to take account of differing LSOA populations.

Table 34 shows the 10 most deprived local authorities in England in terms of this indicator.

Some facts...

- South Gloucestershire is the 273rd most deprived district in England (out of 326) in terms of this measure. The authority is in the 5th national deprivation quintile, which means it is one of the 20% least deprived districts in England.
- Hackney (London) is the most deprived local authority nationally, Hart (Hampshire) is the least deprived.

5.3 Average of LSOA Scores

This measure is similar to the Average of LSOA ranks as it describes the district as a whole. But measuring <u>scores</u> takes into account 'extreme' scores i.e. particularly deprived or un-deprived areas, which are concealed if the ranks are used.

Table 35 shows the 10 most deprived local authorities in England in terms of this indicator.

Some facts...

- South Gloucestershire is the 272nd most deprived local authority in England (out of 326). The authority is in the 5th national deprivation quintile, which means it is one of the 20% least deprived districts in England.
- Liverpool is the most deprived district nationally, Hart (Hampshire) is the least deprived.

5.4 Extent

This measure shows how widespread high levels of deprivation are in a district. It measures the proportion of a districts population living in the most deprived 10% of LSOAs in the country (a proportion of the population in the next most deprived areas is also taken into account).

Table 36 shows the 10 most deprived districts in England in terms of this indicator.

Some facts...

- South Gloucestershire is ranked 268th nationally (out of 326). 0.01% of its population live within the most deprived LSOAs in the country.
- Hackney (London) is the most deprived district nationally, 77% of its population live in the most deprived 10% of LSOAs in England.

5.5 Local Concentration

This measure helps identify districts 'hot spots' of deprivation. Local concentration is the population weighted average of the ranks of a districts most deprived LSOAs that contain exactly 10% of the districts population.

Table 37 shows the 10 most deprived local authorities in England in terms of this indicator.

Some facts...

- South Gloucestershire is ranked 265th nationally which means it is in the 5th national quintile or within the 20% least deprived local authorities in England.
- Blackpool is the most deprived local authority in England in terms of this indicator, Hart (Hampshire) is the least deprived.

5.6 Income Scale

This measure is a direct count of the number of people within the district who are income deprived.

Table 38 shows the 10 most deprived districts in England in terms of this indicator.

Some facts...

- 20,855 people in South Gloucestershire are 'income deprived'. South Gloucestershire is ranked 113rd nationally meaning it is in the 2nd most deprived national quintile.
- Birmingham is the most deprived district nationally, and the Isles of Scilly are the least deprived.

5.7 Employment Scale

This measure is a direct count of the number of people within the district who are income deprived.

Table 39 shows the 10 most deprived districts in England in terms of this indicator.

Some facts...

- In South Gloucestershire 8,865 people are 'employment deprived'. South Gloucestershire is ranked 109th nationally meaning it is in the 2nd national quintile.
- Birmingham is the most deprived district nationally, and the Isles of Scilly are the least deprived.

7. Conclusions

The ID 2010 is the most detailed study of deprivation in England to date.

In general terms South Gloucestershire remains relatively un-deprived. However it does have some sub-ward level 'pockets of deprivation' in some domains, featuring on a national scale.

The results provide statistical evidence support the perception that there are some small areas of South Gloucestershire which are significantly more deprived than others.

Whilst there are certain parts of the district where there is a greater concentration of deprivation, residents experiencing deprivation can be found in all areas and these individuals and households should not be ignored.
