Key Milestones/Achievements during the reporting Period

The Health Scrutiny Work programme details the issues that were scrutinized throughout the year but the key milestone for me was the scrutiny of UHB's actions following the independent investigation into the management response to allegations about staff behaviours related to the death of a baby at Bristol Children's Hospital by Verita.

We heard from the parent on how he felt UHB and let down his family and whilst UHB apologised to the parents, when I asked UHB will they provide financial support to the family for their legal challenge they said "No" even though UHB had paid for legal advice to protect their own staff.

For me it illustrated how the odds are stacked against the family or anyone challenging the NHS. Public money can be spent on legal advice to protect the organisation but not the family who had been let down. This matter is still ongoing.

What “added value” to the local community have you been able to achieve through your special responsibilities?

I have been able to challenge Health providers in the public interest and hold them to account in public.

How have your special responsibilities enabled the Council to be more effective?

I attend agenda setting meetings where we are able to prioritise what issues need to be scrutinized in the public interest.

In what ways has the exercise of your special responsibilities supported the core objectives of the Council?
