New primary and secondary school places for Lyde Green: have your say on the designs ahead of the formal planning application consultation process

As part of the plans for the development of Lyde Green, the council agreed with housing developers the transfer of land and a financial contribution for the provision of the equivalent of 2 primary schools and a contribution towards a new secondary school. The council has already delivered the first Lyde Green primary school which opened in 2015. We are now planning to bring forward proposals to commission the following:

- new primary school places equivalent to a 420 place primary school by September 2022. The school will provide for children aged 4-11;
- a new 900 place secondary school (made up of 450 places required to mitigate the impact of new housing and 450 places to meet basic need growth) by September 2022. The school will provide for children aged 11-16.

We want to share plans for these proposals and to hear the views of local residents.

Because of the current pandemic and consequent difficulties in holding public meetings, we are providing all the information relating to the proposals and designs online and we are encouraging local residents to respond and make any comments. This will help us develop the plans in advance of submitting proposals for formal planning approval.

Please comment on the design proposals using the online form. The deadline for comments is Monday 27 July 2020. As well as this informal engagement, there will be a separate, more formal opportunity to comment as part of the planning application consultation process.
