



Bows and specialist archery equipment for disabled users

MEMBER AWARDED FUNDING CASE STUDY

Cleve Archers is an inclusive sports club, founded in 1960, that aims to provide an all-inclusive facility for all to engage in the sport of archery. **In March 2018 the club received Member Awarded Funding of £1,500 as a 33% contribution towards the costs of archery bows and specialist equipment for disabled users.**

Club members are active in the local community and run taster sessions in schools for students. They also welcome community groups to their outdoor facility in Hambrook and indoor facility at Chipping Sodbury School Sports Complex.



The Club promotes partnership working and as an example of this, a Cleve Club member and qualified instructor holds regular archery sessions at Pauls Place in Coalpit Heath using specialist archery equipment for disabled users.

Three archery bows and a sight were purchased by the funding and these were adapted to enable disabled people to participate in and enjoy the sport of archery by a volunteer in Frampton Cotterell working with the Remap charity that makes bespoke equipment.

In March 2019, the BBC filmed the series *Eat Well for Less* at Pauls Place and filmed members of Pauls Place using the specialist equipment which was funded by MAF.
